## 1. Sustainability

I believe that the Parish Council have signed up to the climate change emergency which is commendable. As a PC we are in a position to potentially influence the rate of progress by considering the following:

For the activities and processes we carry out as a Parish Council

- Calculating the Carbon Footprint.
- > Auditing our activities for energy, water and waste management.
- > Establishing some clear targets for reduction.
- > Run an awareness campaign for us and our employees
- > Ensure that for all projects we action, we assess the sustainability impact.
- > Ensure we publicize what we are doing to hold ourselves to account.

For the Parish as a whole

- > Establish a sustainability working group involving all key stakeholders, for example
  - o School
  - o Churches
  - o Library
  - o Lyth Hill Land Management
  - Village shops/retailers
  - Scouts and cubs etc etc
- > Use this group to identify key actions for the village such as
  - o Car sharing scheme
  - Promoting the bike and bus
  - Running an awareness campaign on climate change, the key issues and what we can do.
  - Run information events for the village
  - o Tree Planting
  - Encouraging the shops to think as green as practical.
  - Encourage and support our younger generation to make a difference
  - Electric car charging points (could we as the Parish Council support this)

There is a great deal of guidance available and having attended recently a Sustainability Forum run by Shropshire County Council I would expect that we could get support from them as well. They need us to be engaged if they set a target of zero carbon for 2030 (only 10 years to go)

There may well already be activities regarding this issue which I am not aware of.
