


Thank you for asking me to quote for the tree safety inspection at Bayston Hill

Specification to include:

- Survey all trees overhanging the designated public footpaths and bounding neighbouring properties;
 - Full survey (roots, stem and crown) for all trees with limbs overhanging the footpaths. All of these trees will be tagged and included in the written report.
 - Stability survey for trees in falling distance of the footpaths, but no limbs overhanging the paths. Trees with no limbs overhanging the paths will not be included in the written report, or tagged, unless there is a significant structural problem with the roots and or stem, which would pose a risk to the public. These will be marked with orange paint for removal and plotted on the tree location plan for use by the contractor.
- Tag all fully surveyed trees, with limbs which overhang the designated footpaths. Tag numbers will correspond to Tag Numbers in the report, the photo detail and the tree location plan.
- All trees will be visually Inspected from ground level. If there is any concern about structural integrity of specific trees, an aerial inspection would be recommended as part of the remedial action, not covered within this quote.
- The Inspection will inform risk assessments and remedial actions, which will be given priorities for the timing of works. Urgent through to pre-emptive work. If any trees are considered highly dangerous at the time of inspection, the estate will be notified immediately.
- The report will be provided in a diary format, so this can be updated following storms, or if any work to trees is completed between Inspections, this can also be added.
- Any work proposed to each of the trees will be photographed and Indicative pruning positions will be provided, where necessary. Photographs can be used to monitor the health of crowns over time.
- Felling licence application for the area of crack willow, as discussed with Peter.

Costs

The report will provided in PDF format, along with photographs and maps. These can also be provided on FieldMaps or as a shapefile. The survey would be done at a time suitable for the Parish Council. Ideally it should be done in late spring/ summer to pick up on any ash dieback in the trees adjacent to the roads.

Copies of Professional Indemnity and Public Liability insurance can be sent via email if required.

Invoicing

- The reports would have to be invoiced on a road-by-road basis, once the survey and report have been completed.
- Invoices can be paid via BACS or as a cheque.
- Invoices must be paid within 2 weeks.
