GRANT APPLICATION

Each year the Parish Council has a small budget allocation available to give as grants to local organisations to help improve the well being of Bayston Hill residents.

Please use the guidance below to confirm your eligibility for a grant.

About you

- you can apply as an individual or an organisation
- you must live or work in the Parish of Bayston Hill or be very closely associated with the Parish.

Your idea for a grant must

- improve the well being of people in Bayston Hill
- support an aspect of the Bayston Hill Parish Plan. Copies of the Parish Plan are available from the Parish Office, the Library and can be downloaded from the web site.

Your application should be

- for a small sum of money a maximum of £500.
- if possible, have some matching funding of between 25%-50%.
- for something that it might be difficult to find funding for from somewhere else

Help with your application

If you are thinking of making an application, please contact the Parish Clerk. If you do not meet all the criteria listed above it might still be possible to apply for a grant.

Number of grants to be awarded

The Council is hoping to award between three and six grants each year, subject to the limits of the fund.

When you have finished your project

We shall expect you to spend the grant within 12 months and submit a short report and statement of accounts. The Parish Clerk will explain the format of the report and accounts to you.

If your grant award is not successful

We shall explain why your application was not successful and advise you about further applications.

We are a enthusiastic Brownie guide group who meet once a week to offer a supportive and engaging space for all girls between the ages of 7-10. We offer them the oppoutunity to develop their skills and learn new things in a multitude of areas, from arts crafts to outdoors and nature. They get to work towards badges and awards and we aim to inspire them and develop their self confidence and belief. We currently

have 15 girls we work with weekly and have a waiting list of younger girls as the older ones move up to guides.

THE REASON FOR YOUR GRANT APPLICATION

9. Explain why you need a grant, who will benefit from it and how.

We need new things! Our arts and crafts materials are very old and some of the equipment is abit hit and miss if it works or not. We would also like to take the girls on a rock climbing adventure however, with the cost of living we are reluctant to ask parents to pay anymore than what they do already (£35 a term) we always want to be an inclusive group were no one girl is left out because of financial reasons so we are hoping a grant may go somewhere in being able to offer all girls the oppourtunity to enjoy some organised outdoor time without the parents feeling pressured into paying more. We would also like to give the girls more of a sense of local and community identity and would really like to purchase them 2nd Bayston Hill hoodies – we feel this would be a lovely keepsake for when they make the move from brownies to guides, and also something for them to wear when they are out and about and representing the village at local events such as rememberance day parade. We would also like to have a flag made for 2nd Bayston Hill that the girls can carry at the rememberance day service and other events in Shrewsbury, i.e St Georges day etc. I think this would really give the girls a sense of identity and make them feel more involved and proud to be part of the community, something which I think its really important, that the girls know where they belong and love where they live. We also plan on litter picking for the Shrewsbury Flower show and shrewsbury food festival, and we would love to represent bayston hill positively in our brownie hoodies to a wider audience.

10. Explain how this grant will assist the Parish Council in achieving the Parish plan.

By helping the girls become more engaged with the local community and giving them a sense that they belong here will no doubt make them become more active members of the community as they grow up. Making them feel proud to represent bayston hill as a member of the girl guiding community would hopefully translate in other areas of their lives especially at such an important age just before they enter adolescence. Encouraging them early on to become active members locally through our litter picking initiatives for example will give them a sense of pride in the area. Looking to the future this sense of identity may be encouraging for where they choose to live or work as adults, and giving them positive experiences as children will only help reinforce this as they grow up.

Hoodies approx. £20 each x 18 = £360 Flag - £90 approx Arts/crafts/felt tips/glue sticks = £30 Rock climbing £8 x 15 = 120
